

GARDEN RECYCLING



BEFORE putting household items such as old pots, pans, plastic bottles or old washbasins into waste, consider reusing them in your garden. Being creative may not only save you money, it may also ensure that your garden survives and flourishes in dry conditions.

Almost anything with a depression can be transformed into a plant pot. Just create holes at the base for drainage before filling with potting mix.

Plastic bottles can be used as a simple self-watering system. Simply create a small hole in the lid and insert the bottle upside down into the soil. This releases water slowly to nourish plant roots. Plastic containers can be used as seedling protectors, or as a deterrent for birds.

Any number of items can be used to create an interesting bird bath, including pans, bowls and dishes. An old letterbox may also create a suitable bird house if placed in a sheltered location.

Using a bit of imagination with your old household items will not only create interesting focal points around your garden, it will also prevent waste from going to landfill.
