

LAUNCH CENTENARY OF FEDERATION PROJECT



KBULG's Centenary of Federation Project will be launched on 26 September 2001. The project involved constructing picnic tables and erecting interpretive signage around Karkurla Park. The picnic tables were built by the Work for the Dole participants and are located approximately every 200m long the walk trail. Interpretive signage is being made up and will be located throughout the park and includes plant identification labels, directional signage and information on some of the unique plants found in the Goldfields.
