



## 2020 Winter Newsletter Pop Quiz – Answer Sheet

1. C) Domestic household waste refers to waste streams generated from the day to day operations of a household on a residential premise. This includes:

- Putrescible waste
- Garden waste
- Cleanfill (soil)
- Clothing and linen
- Tools
- Toys
- Electronic waste
- Packaging waste
- Bricks and concrete (up to 1m<sup>3</sup>)

Waste streams that are not classified as domestic household waste, but are not limited to, the following:

- Bricks and concrete (over 1m<sup>3</sup>)
- Construction and demolition materials;
- Asbestos;
- Contaminated soil;
- More than two vehicle tyres;
- Chemicals and paint; and
- Hazardous materials.

2. A) - Households located within Kalgoorlie-Boulder are permitted to dispose of up to eight (8) tyres a year per rateable property. This includes two (2) tyres on any one time. Tyres must be disposed without rims, and a proof of residence must be provided to dispose tyres.
3. A) A Techcollect e-Waste container is provided for disposal of computers, TVs and printers. Households and small to medium enterprise (SMEs) are allowed to dispose waste generated through day-to-day operations. Maximum 2 items per customer per day.

Commercial disposal of e-Waste is not permitted through the Techcollect service. Please seek alternative commercial arrangements for e-Waste disposal.

4. B) False – But it is open Monday to Sunday from 7am to 5pm.
5. A) True – a small fee applies, \$22.45, to book your bin. Additional bins can be sourced from Cleanaway but this comes at additional cost.
